Even as much working memory declines, musical memory continues to be active. I was invited last week to attend a practice by a couple of the people who have put this together. In a word, I would have to say it was "soulful". I didn't expect the emotions that this choir had on me, as I sat back and listened to their singing. It actually brought me to tears. If possible, it will give you goosebumps on your goosebumps. This group meets every Tuesday morning from 1000 to 1200 at the Erika Quam Theatre to practice the songs that will be sung at the Concert. If you get a chance, just stop by, any time between these hours, or for the whole program and listen. You will be glad that you did.
